Decision of the Regulator to award a licence or not, based on the strength of the findings of the market research. And the country's development agenda.

There results of the survey point to evidence of a need for a school of film, television live performance to be established in the country.

The results also reveal a need for professional training and development of amateurs within the industry as well as people without prior industry experience.



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The general feeling is that the school must be practicaloriented in order to improve the quality of films and television programs.
