
Meeting of the World Council

Your World Council met on December 7th by video conference. All regions of the world were represented by 20 councillors. During a very busy meeting our current and future plans were discussed and several exciting events were approved – some of which are detailed in this enewsletter. The next meeting of the World Council will take place on 8 March 2020.

In addition to the World Council, the Executive Board also meets regularly by video conference.

Please remember that any items you want to be discussed must be submitted to the secretary at least two weeks before the meeting (ie 23 February 2020). Proposals for World Congresses or Regional Congresses must be discussed with the World councillors for the region and, if one exists, the Regional Council. No more than one proposal for a Regional Congress should be brought forward for each Region for consideration.



THE INSEA MANIFESTO

WE BELIEVE THAT:

ALL LEARNERS, REGARDLESS OF AGE, NATIONALITY OR BACKGROUND, SHOULD HAVE ENTITLEMENT AND ACCESS TO VISUAL ART EDUCATION.

EDUCATION THROUGH ART INSPIRES KNOWLEDGE, APPRECIATION AND CREATION OF CULTURE.

CULTURE IS A BASIC HUMAN RIGHT. CULTURE PROMOTES SOCIAL JUSTICE AND PARTICIPATION IN CONTEMPORARY SOCIETIES. A STRONG DEMOCRACY IS AN INCLUSIVE SOCIETY. AND AN INCLUSIVE SOCIETY IS A STRONG DEMOCRACY.

ALL LEARNERS ARE ENTITLED TO AN ART EDUCATION THAT DEEPLY CONNECTS THEM TO THEIR WORLD. TO THEIR CULTURAL HISTORY. IT CREATES OPENINGS AND HORIZONS FOR THEM TO NEW WAYS OF SEEING, THINKING, DOING AND BEING.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMES AND CURRICULUM MODELS SHOULD PREPARE CITIZENS WITH CONFIDENT FLEXIBLE INTELLIGENCES, AND CREATIVE VERBAL AND NON-VERBAL COMMUNICATION SKILLS.

VISUAL ART EDUCATION OPENS POSSIBILITIES AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR LEARNERS TO DISCOVER THEMSELVES. THEIR CREATIVITY, VALUES, ETHICS, SOCIETIES AND CULTURES.

VISUAL ART EDUCATION DEVELOPS AN UNDERSTANDING OF CREATIVE PRACTICE THROUGH KNOWLEDGE, UNDERSTANDING AND PRODUCTION OF ART IN CONTEXTS.

VISUAL ART EDUCATION DEVELOPS THE ABILITIES TO THINK CRITICALLY AND IMAGINATIVELY. IT FOSTERS/AIMS AT INTERCULTURAL UNDERSTANDING. AND AN EMPATHIC COMMITMENT TO CULTURAL DIVERSITY.

VISUAL ART EDUCATION SHOULD BE SYSTEMATIC AND BE PROVIDED OVER A NUMBER OF YEARS. AS IT IS A DEVELOPMENTAL PROCESS, LEARNERS SHOULD ENGAGE WITH "MAKING" ALONGSIDE LEARNING ABOUT ART.

VISUAL ART EDUCATION DEVELOPS A RANGE OF LITERACIES AND AESTHETIC DISPOSITIONS. WITH A MAJOR FOCUS ON VISUAL LITERACY AND AESTHETIC ASSESSMENT.

VISUAL LITERACY IS AN ESSENTIAL SKILL IN TODAY'S WORLD. IT ENCOURAGES APPRECIATION AND UNDERSTANDING OF VISUAL COMMUNICATION AND THE ABILITY TO CRITICAL ANALYSE AND MAKE MEANINGFUL IMAGES.

ART ENCOURAGES THE DEVELOPMENT OF MANY TRANSFERABLE SKILLS WHICH ENHANCE LEARNING IN OTHER CURRICULUM AREAS.

VISUAL ARTS IN SCHOOLS HELP STUDENTS TO UNDERSTAND THEMSELVES, BUILDING CONFIDENCE AND SELF-ESTEEM. AND CONTRIBUTE SIGNIFICANTLY TO THEIR OWN WELL-BEING.

Summary Notes on Functions (please refer to the Constitution for more detail):

- The general Assembly consists of all members of the Society and determines the main lines of policy. It normally meets at the World Congress every two years.
- The World Council (WC) consists of the officers of the Executive Board, elected World Councillors, ex-officio and co-opted members and is responsible to the General Assembly for the work of the Society. WC normally meets twice or three times
- 3. The Executive Board (EB) consists of the officers of the Society; President, Immediate Past President; two Vice Presidents. the Secretary and the Treasurer. The EB normally meets at least 5 limes per year
- 4. There are three (2019-21) Boards of Council, each tasked with key aspects of the Society's work (click on the links for more detail)
- 5. Regional Councils may be formed and work to further the aims of the Society within the region. Of the six regions, there are two with Regional Councils; Asia and Europe.
- 6. Working Groups may be formed from time to time and may be tasked with advising the Society on key issues. These are small groups chaired by elected World Councillors.
