# **Biography Linda Knight**

Linda Knight is an artist and academic who specialises in critical and speculative arts practices and methods. Linda devised 'Inefficient Mapping' as a methodological protocol for conducting fieldwork in projects informed by 'post-'theories. In her role as Associate Professor at RMIT University, Australia Linda creates transdisciplinary projects across early childhood, creative practice, and digital media. Together with Jacina Leong, Linda is a founding member of the Guerrilla Knowledge Unit, an artist collective that curates interface jamming performances between the public and Al technologies. Linda has exhibited digitally and physically in Australia, UK, USA, Canada, NZ, and South America and has been awarded arts research grants and prizes with international reach and impact, most recently this includes an Australian Research Council Discovery project that designs novel technologies for framing and enabling young children's active play.

She founded Artistikong Kabataan Philippines inc to empower Filipino youth with leadership skills through creativity in 2011; and ARTDIALOGO in 2016 which provides a platform for ASEAN artists to collaborate, promote intercultural dialogue and community development. She furthered her studies in Development Policy at De La Salle University. Her contribution and continuous exemplar work in promoting cultural understanding and empowering children and youth through the arts made her become an Internationally Acclaimed Young Woman leader in Art. She has been recognized by several institutions and governments bodies; among such are UNESCO and Daimler Chrysler (Mondialogo), The Philippine Embassy in Singapore, Madrid and in Malaysia; the ASEAN Committee in Madrid, Spain. She is also an inaugural fellow of ASEAN Youth Fellowship Program 2018 by Singapore International Foundation and National Youth Council Singapore. She had several group art exhibitions across Asia; has installed over 30 murals and impacted thousands of children across the world; designed and implemented various programs for communities, educators and youth that uplift morale and open opportunities to up skill and see the world.
